


COVID-19 at Michigan Medicine by the Numbers

Michigan Medicine is posting daily snapshots of our current COVID-19 testing and inpatient count.

As of April 14, 1:00 pm:

- Total patients tested for COVID-19 at Michigan Medicine since the pandemic began (includes pending tests): 4,354
- · Total positive tests: 805
- . Tests pending (waiting for results): 100
- Current inpatients that are COVID-19 positive: 225
 Total COVID-19 patients discharged to date: 213
- . COVID-19 patients discharged in the last 24 hours: 11

COVID-19 in Michigan Map



27,001 confirmed cases in Michigan. These include 157 cases out of rate, 439 cases from the Michigan Department of Corrections, 23 cases from the Federal Correctional Institution, and 91 cases unknown.


